Postcard To My Favourite Author




Dear J.K.Rowling



YASHODA'S LIBRARY

Yashoda Shenoy, a Class VII student of TD High School ,Fort Kochi runs a free library from her own home where you can find over 3,500 books in English, Malayalam, Hindi, Tamil, Sanskrit, and Konkani.


Yashoda's love for reading books started when she was in Std III. Once, her father had to pay a fine for not returning on time the book he had taken from a library. "If that is so, how can poor children afford to read books?" Yashoda asked herself.

When Yashoda needed space to set up her library, her father who is an artist converted a part of his gallery for her use. A family friend helped in building the racks for the books. The library was inaugurated by Dr K. S. Radhakrishnan, former Vice Chancellor of Kalady Shankara University on Republic day.


The library now has around 110 members, and Yashoda also requests if each of them could donate books from their personal collection, whenever possible.

Yashoda does not charge any membership fee, but she does request that the books be returned on time. It wasn't easy for Yashoda to start a library and she looked to her father for help. Dinesh Shenoy put up a post on Facebook appealing to book lovers to contribute to his daughter's free library. Soon, help came from her family, who sent her books worth Rs 10,000. Later, Yashoda also started collecting books from scrap dealers.

The library, which began with 2000 books, has now more than 3500 books: novels, stories, poems and non-fiction, for both children and adults, in Malayalam, English, Hindi, Sanskrit and Konkani. Books once taken have to be returned in two weeks but can be taken again. No fine is charged if they are not returned on time. For the aged and the sick, books are delivered to their houses. The youngest member of the library is two-and-a-half years old, and she comes every week with her father to borrow books. Yashoda has special provisions for her.



Puthuvayil Narayana Panicker is known as the Father of the Library Movement in Kerala. The activities of the Kerala Grandhasala Sanghom which was initiated by P. N. Panicker ignited a popular cultural movement in Kerala at the end of which the state acquired total literacy in the 1990s.In the new face of Kerala Grandhasala Sangham as Kerala State Library Council, the founder of the organisation, P.N. Panicker was out owing to political interference. But Panicker needed to work further for the society, so, in 1977 he founded the Kerala Association for Non-formal Education and Development (KANFED). KANFED was highly instrumental in starting the Kerala State Literacy Mission which leads Kerala for its total literacy movement and Kerala became the first State which won total literacy.He has also taken keen interest in promoting Agricultural Books Corner, Friendship Village Movement (Sauhrudagramam), Reading Programmes for Families, Grants for Books and building libraries and Best Reader's Award P.N. Panickerfoundation.

READING DAY

At last the Government of Kerala stepped in to accept the contributions of P.N. Panicker and ordered to observe 19 June annually as Vayanadinam (Day of Reading) with a week-long series of activities at schools and public institutions to honour the contributions of P.N. Panicker to the cause of literacy, education and library movement.
